# Welcome to Skippy's OSHC The Range Vacation Care

#### Cost per day

\$82 per child / per day **including morning tea**, **lunch**, **and afternoon tea**. This is the full fee and may be reduced if you are entitled to any Child Care Subsidy. Any excursion/incursion costs are in addition to this fee. **Cancellations must be made 24 hours prior to the booked date to avoid being charged.** 

### Hours of Operation

7:30am – 5:30pm

As the service is not licenced to operate after 5:30pm, a late pick-up fee of \$2 per minute is payable in cash to the educator on duty. If you know you are running late to collect your child, please ensure you contact the service as soon as possible.

#### **Location**

The Rockhampton Girls Grammar School Campus H2 Building next to the Health Centre (Access via Agnes Street off Little Athelstan Street). Parking is at the bottom of the hill, please do not drive onto the school grounds.

#### **Bookings – Via Xplor App**

Please ensure all bookings for vacation care are made through your Xplor app. Select the calendar icon at the bottom of your screen and select "New" with the corresponding date/s you would like to book. This will automatically confirm your booking unless we have reached capacity, in which case you will receive a notification "Your booking request has been sent to the service." The Service Co-Ordinator will confirm your booking if a place becomes available. **Any changes or cancellations to your booking/s can be made via your Xplor App.** 

#### **Food Provided**

At vacation care we offer a selection of continental style meal options, fruit and yoghurt or custard for morning tea, sandwiches and wraps for lunch, as well as a grazing platter of cheese crackers, baby veg dip etc for afternoon tea. Your child is more than welcome to bring along their own snacks, please ensure they are packed in a named insulated lunch box with ice bricks as our fridge space is limited. GF and LF options provided to children with intolerances.

#### **Excursion information**

Permission forms for excursions will be sent through Xplor a week in advance. If you are filling out permission forms on your mobile phone you will need to download Adobe Acrobat to complete. Alternatively, there will also be permission forms available at the service the day of an excursion. If there is no permission form signed, your child will be unable to attend excursions.

If you child in booked into the program on days with an excursion/incursion, the corresponding fee will be added to your account for payment. This will be debited along with your regular fees on your next billing cycle.

Sun Safety Policy Including SunSmart Clothing and Hats: Please familiarise yourself with our "Sun Protection Policy and Procedure" (available from our centre administration.) This policy contains crucial information regarding the policy that Skippy's ELC enforces to ensure the health and safety of all children and educators.

Please see below acceptable clothing for all children taken from above policy:-'Ensure that their child's clothing provides adequate protection from UVR. Cancer Council Queensland recommends clothing with the following features:

• Dark coloured

- Collars and sleeves
- Closely woven fabric

If your child comes dressed in inappropriate clothing such as singlets or dresses with no sleeves, your child will be asked by educators to change into SunSmart clothing before going outside. If your child does not have alternative clothing in their bag the educator on duty will ensure they stay in the undercover area.

During Vacation Care we like to spontaneously offer water play experiences throughout the day, if you would like your child to participate in these experiences, please pack a spare set of clothing or togs including swimming rashie and a towel.

#### **Broad Brimmed Hat:**

To ensure adequate sun protection for your child please ensure your child brings a broad brimmed hat every day. NO CAPS! If your child does not bring one, they may miss out on activities planned in the outdoor environment or excursions.

#### **Enclosed Shoes:**

Please ensure that your child brings enclosed shoes everyday as we may participate in experiences that require enclosed shoes. In addition, our excursion policy states it is a requirement for all children to wear enclosed shoes while on excursions. If they do not bring enclosed shoes, they will not be able to attend these excursions.

#### Water Bottles, Spare Set of Clothes and a Bag:

Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle and a bag every day. This ensures that your child's belongings are kept together, and a drink of water is easily accessible throughout the day. End of Vacation care: lost property will be donated to local charity.

### **Electronic Devices**

The Australian Institute of Family Studies sates the national guidelines for recreational screen time for children and young people aged 5 - 17yr of age is no more than 2 hours a day. If your child would like to bring their electronic device to vacation care, they are permitted to use their devises between 7:30am - 8:00am, 12:00 - 12:30pm and 5:00pm - 5:30pm. Devices will be locked in the office at all other times. For safety reasons children are not permitted access to the internet and are only allowed to access pre downloaded games from home with their device switched to aeroplane mode.
